



## Confident Regals Hope To End Series Tonight

BRANDON — Brandon Regals, hoping to end the Western Hockey League best-of-seven final series here tonight, are exhibiting plenty of confidence. The WHL winner meets Quebec Aces of the Quebec Hockey League in the best-of-nine Edinburgh Cup finals.

Coach Don "Bones" Raleigh said, "We're certainly going to try and wrap it up tonight. But we can't afford to relax now and to take it four straight we must play sharp hockey."

Raleigh would not give a definite answer on possible player changes until he meets with his players.

"I had been contemplating dressing Bob Chorley in my place

for one game but that is unlikely because I do not like breaking a winning combination. However, this is a democratic club and I'll wait and see what my players think about it."

Hal Laycock, New Westminster coach, had no alibis for the series standing and said all three games could have gone either way, but Brandon had the breaks.

"But then, a good club makes its own breaks," he said.

Laycock said he had no player changes, commenting "What choice have I got."

## May 19 May Be Starting Date For Rupert Senior Baseball

Senior baseball will get underway Sunday, May 19 in Terrace and if all goes well an official opening game will also be held here, it was decided last night at the annual general meeting of the Prince Rupert and District Baseball league.

Approval of the Terrace fixture was given after delegates of the Terrace Loggers asked for a Rupert team to be present so that the season could be launched on that date.

Final decision on whether Prince Rupert will hold a game that day will be made Sunday, May 5—deadline for team managers to present tentative line-ups and show proof they are going to field a team this season.

It is hoped by that time the usual four league entries, Gordon and Anderson, Hotelmen, Esquires and Terrace will have sufficient players on their rosters.

Muriel Ayres was appointed official scorekeeper at \$4 per game.

### LEAGUE SCHEDULE

The meeting also approved a move to make the home team responsible for gate receipts and collections; voted to buy a new public address system with record-player attachment and referred to the executive the matter of umpires and the drawing-up of the league schedule.

Paul Ducharme, spokesman for the Prince Rupert Pony baseball league told the meeting his group wished to start play on May 13 and asked the senior league's cooperation on scheduling and times of practices.

Two notices of motion for amending the constitution were given, one on the strength of teams and the other that in all future league playoffs Terrace and Prince Rupert umpires be used.

A vote of thanks was given the Parks board and also City Works Superintendent Carl Gustafson for all the work done at Roosevelt park. Twenty two loads of fill have been spread on the field, the back stop reinforced with heavy wire, portable bleach-

ers erected and an extra high net over the backstop is to be installed.

Rusty Ford was named chairman of a work party to erect the fence this Sunday.

Also attending the meeting from Terrace were E. C. Sargent, president of the Terrace club, Bill Denbow and Alf Davy.


