SEAWAY WHARF PROCEEDING, HOPE WILL ATTRACT BUSINESS

MONTREAL (P) — The St. Lawrence Seaway authority has decided to proceed with wharf development on its own beside the south shore plains across from Montreal Island, in the

hope that private business will take note. Transport Minister Hees, touring the 114-mile seaway from Montreal to Iroquois, Ont., for the first time since taking office, announced Wednesday that a 4,000-foot wharf will be

built upstream from Cote Ste. Catharine Lock. The wharf—capable of handling five or six scaway-size ships at one time—will be inside the seaway channel itself, where it cuts across the river shore facing the turbulent Lachine Rapids.

Mr. Hees said the authority would provide the wharf, and then rent facilities to private shipping companies. Estimated cost of the dock is \$1,500,000 or \$2,000,000. The wharf would be ready when the seaway is opened in 1959.
