

the rice, salt and water in a 2quart saucepan. Bring to a vigorous hoil. Cover. Turn the heat down low. Simmer over this low heat 14 minutes. Remove the saucepan from the heat but leave the lid on 10 minutes. After the rice cooks, stir in the pepper, mushroom soup and water. Stir into the frankfurter mixture. Spread over a greased shallow baking dish holding at least 5 cups. Cut the cheese into triangular pieces. Arrange the cheese and the remaining uncooked slices of frankfurters in an interesting design over the top. Cover and store in the refrigerator until mealtime.

Remove baking dish from refrigerator and allow to come to room temperature. Broil until hot through and until the cheese is browned. Serve immediately. This recipe makes 5 to 6 generous servings.




Three-Bedroom 2-Storey Design Contains Good Storage Space

The architect has provided a plentiful supply of cupboard and storage space including a sewing room and linen storage off the open upstairs hall. The front door is well-protected from the weather. Best orientation of the house would be obtained with the garage on the northern side
