



### Braves Aim To Take Title From Brooklyn

The sparring over, the champion New York Yankees and Brooklyn Dodgers settled down to the serious business of defending their laurels as the 1957 major league baseball season opened on all fronts today.

Weather permitting, all 16 teams, including Baltimore and Washington, which staged a sneak preview Monday in a traditional opener in the capital, were to see action.

One game will be played at night, between the Dodgers and Phillies in Philadelphia.

The Orioles, who hadn't won an opener since they re-entered the American League in 1954, got a jump on the other clubs Monday, defeating the Senators 7-6 in 11 innings.

It marked the first time the Baltimore entry ever had undisputed possession of first place.

**Triandos' Power**

A 29-year-old rookie outfielder, Carl Powis, drove in the winning run with a sacrifice fly, but the big Baltimore hero was veteran Gus Triandos. The strapping catcher got away to a fast start with a home run and four runs.

Billy Loes, last of four Baltimore pitchers, was credited with the victory.

The defeat was charged to Camilo Pascual, who relieved starter Bob Chakales in the eighth. Hector Brown, Baltimore's starter, was routed by a five-run Washington attack in the fourth.

## Bruins Out To Prove Rally Was No Fluke

MONTREAL (CP) — The fired-up Boston Bruins set out tonight to prove that their big win Sunday over Montreal Canadiens was no fluke.

"We've got a capable team," said coach Milt Schmidt confidently as he led his Bruins into Montreal for the fifth game of the Stanley Cup final.

#### UNDISMAYED

Bruins appeared undismayed at the necessity of keeping on winning to keep the series alive. One more loss means they're out and that Canadiens will retain the prized trophy they won last season at the expense of Detroit Red Wings.

If the Bruins win tonight the series moves back to Boston for the sixth game, Thursday. Another Boston win then would send the teams back to Montreal for the seventh and deciding game Saturday.

YANKEES OMIT TONY KUBEK

NEW YORK (AP) — Close the dictionaries and put away those superlatives that have been reserved for Tony Kubek.

Kubek is the 20-year-old "phenomenon" who was to inherit the left field post of the world champion New York Yankees.

He was blasting the ball all over in the early days of spring training.

But then he hit a long slump. Now he is "de-phenedomed" to the extent that he isn't even in the Yanks' starting lineup against Washington Senators.

Instead of Kubek, who at this early stage has been "awarded" the rookie-of-the-year plaque, Elston Howard drew the left field assignment.

Said manager Casey Stengel: "This doesn't mean I'm going to two-platoon Kubek and Howard, either. We'll probably face a righthander, Frank Sullivan, in our next game in Boston and Howard will be my left fielder then, too."
