Ormes Roughnecks kept their flawless no-loss record intact in junior floor hockey play last night with a 17-10 victory over Parker Motor Thunderbirds. In the first senior league game of the season, Flyers edged Huskies 15-13.

Question to be submitted to the electors entitled to vote on money by-laws requiring the assent of the electors of School District No. 52 (Prince Rupert):
