



# \$5,000 PER DAY

Bonus in Australia Will Reach Huge Sum-Parliamentarians Invited to Extend Trip.

Sydney, N.S.W., Nov. 6-It has been decided to invite the imperial parliamentarians, who are to visit Canada in August next, to extend their visit to Australia.

A new expenditure of \$5000 a day is anticipated by the Federal treasurer in connection with the bonus for babies.

The Lord Mayor, Alderman Allan Taylor, has suggested that the city of Sydney discard the rate now imposed on improved or rental value, and instead impose an all round rate of four pence (eight cents) in the pound on the unimproved capital value.
