

BARON VON BETHMAN-HOLLWEG IN THE REICHSTAG SAYS THAT THE GERMAN EMPIRE WILL STAND BEHIND HER ALLIES, AUSTRIA AND ITALY.

Berlin, Dec. 7 .- The Imperial Chancellor made a declaration in the course of a speech in the Reichstag, discussing the Balkan situation. It was a repetition of the statement made at the time of the controversy over the question of Bosnia and Herzegovania in 1908, which then caused an immense sensation in the European capitals. Although at that period it threatened to sweep away the pacific Russian cabinet, the current of feeling aroused among the Slavs ultimately brought peace.




