THIS PROVINCE AND THE NAVAL QUESTION.

The Borden naval policy has made things difficult for the British Columbia Conservatives, who are devoted to the conception of a Canadian navy. How to maintain their position without coming into conflict with the Dominion government is exercising their ingenuity and resourcefulness. The Navy League of British Columbia recently formulated a new platform designed to meet the sit. uation. After declaring its support of the policy now before the house on the grounds POLICIES COMPARED. that it meets many of the demands of the league, the platform concludes with this declaration:

"The Navy League is in favor of the present proposals as far as they are known at this date, reserving to itself the right to criticize the permanent policy which the Premier has promised to submit to the country should it be found not to contain provision for other matters which the league has persistently advocated, among them the establishment of a fleet unit based on the Pacific Coast and the construction of graving docks."


