ANOTHER SOURCE OF PROFIT FROM THE SEA

Party Investigating Kelp Beds of Coast With View of Using Plant as Fertilizer.

Following the crooked shoreline of Southeastern Alaska, from Dixon's Entrance to Juneau including the shores of the most important of the numerous islands, mapping and observing the kelp beds en route, is the task before the party of botanists from the University of the State of Washington.

The object of the expedition is to get data concerning the extent and value of the kelp beds in order to find the economic possibilities of utilizing it commercially as a fertilizer.

CRAGANOUR IS SOLD TO ARGENTINA FOR \$150,000

London, June 7.—The sum of \$150,000 was paid today by the government of Argentina for the horse Craganour, which was first past the winning post in the Derby on Wednesday, but was disqualified for bumping.
