



Rev. Canon Rix struck the nail on the head when he said at the Methodst banquet that the former German ideals of music, philosophy and poetry had in the last number of years been pushed aside by the ruling passion of militarism. One thing is certain, that the preeminence of Germany in the world of scholars has of late been rapidly losing ground. It is ever true that neither a nation nor an individual can hold two ideals at the same time. There are still, of course, some eminent scholars in Germany and some had hoped that they would not fall in line with the tyranny of the Kaser but recent events have shown that they have. The fact that they do support him in his vandalism shows that they too have forsaken the high ideal of culture for its own sake and have fallen down before the false god of brute force.

The shifting of the German attack from Paris to Antwerp would almost indicate a change of policy on behalf of the enemy. In the early stages the aim was to crush France with a quick blow and then turn back on Russia with all her power. For the present it was






