

EDITORIALS

The political situation seems more favorable in Mexico than it has been for several months General Villa, who is everywhere regarded as the strongest personality among the Mexican public men, is now in the City of Mexico, where he proposes to keep the peace and allow business to go on undisturbed. He has troops enough under his command if he chooses to use them for this purpose alone. He seems to have made terms with Zapata, who has been a thorn in the side of every other aspirant to political power. He is probably afraid of Villa, who would certainly not hesitate to exterminate his adherents if he could not capture their leader. Carranza vacated Mexico City before Villa entered it, and has established himself elsewhere. There are indications of a willingness on his part to make terms with those already in the capital, and this would likely end the civil war.

Villa has announced his intention to support for the provisional presidency the nominee of the late convention. pending the holding of a general election to enable the people of Mexico to make a free choice of an actual president. If Carranza falls in with this policy this will bring about a

prolonged truce, which the course of events may easily convert into a lasting peace. In favor of such a solution the whole moral influence of the United States would be cast, and that influence would certainly be more potent now than when the American army was in possession of Vera Cruz. The Mexicans, with their other peculiarities, are a proud people, and they resent the idea of appearing before the world as coerced by foreign power in the management of their own -Globe. affairs.

New York and other Atlantic coast papers take the view that a "United States of Europe" under the domination of the powers that prevail in the present conflict offers the best possible permanent solution of European peace. It would mean 30,000,000 soldiers, the united navies, the united revenues, united territories and dependencies, the united populations, which would approximately be 17-18 of the world under one domination, against 1-18 of the earth surface in the United States of America.

The scheme is a fanclful one that may work some centuries hence when wars, national jealousies, trade rivalry, racial distinctions and religi-
