DEMOCRACY AND WAR.

The world is gradually becoming more democratic, and the Tories of today are more liberal than the Liberals of a generation ago. It is not a matter of politics, but a natural process of evolution. People are naturally becoming broader. More liberal education and cheaper and quicker means of transportation have done much to bring this about. Narrow prejudice is chiefly a result of ignorance. Except in times of acute national crisis. people are becoming less national and more international; more cosmopolitan, and therefore more democratic.

It seems clear that one good result of the present calamitous war will be a stronger growth of cosmopolitanism and democracy. The different peoples are getting to know and understand each other better. Men of different nations and races, and of widely different classes of society, cannot fight side by side on the field of battle without getting to know each other better, and appreciate each others' good qualities more fairly. This applies even to those who are opposing each other in the life and death struggle. Germans have been taught to hate Britain and the British, yet the German prisoners who have been sent to Britain and have found that the British know how to treat an opponent fairly must, after the bitterness has died down, appreciate the good qualities of the British people.

War and death are great levelers. As Canon Rix so aptly put it recently, "The most al man can be is-a man." In the past years, there has been a tremendous rush after things. The social standing of a man has been measured by what he has been able to buy. What a man possesses has become more important than the man; the standard has been one of wealth rather than worth. Today Europe is in the melting pot, and the whole!






