

KITSILANO DEAL.

Bowser's chickens are coming home to roost. The Dominion government has declared that the purchase of the Kitsilano Indian Reserve, by the McBride government, was invalid, as it was done without the consent of the Indian Department.

It will be remembered that, over two years ago, the McBride government claimed to have purchased this valuable piece of property from the Indians for \$300,000, and, incidentally, Mr. Read, a legal associate of the Hon. W. J. Bowser, "earned" a commission of \$120,000 in putting the deal through. At the time, the Liberal press asserted that the Provincial government had carried the deal through illegally, and that, though they had handed over \$300,000 and a huge slice of commission, they would never be able to obtain a title to the property. Events have proved these assertions to be correct.

The Attorney General, who is supposed to stand, above all things, for law in British Columbia, permitted an absolutely illegal deal to go through, and also took care that his legal partner received \$120,000 for doing something which was illegal. 




