MEXICO CITY, January 7.—The city of Couzetlan was de- BIG INCREASE stroyed utterly by Saturday's earthquake, which caused two thousand casualties among the inhabitants, including more than one thousand dead, according to official reports given out last night by Presidential Military Headquarters. From advices received from officers stationed at Vera Cruz, which was the centre of the disturbance, the entire garrison at Teocela was killed or injured. The dead among the soldiers numbered thirty and the w. injured sixty.

Virtually all the roads in the surrounding district are either flooded or destroyed, according to reports, making a survey of the destruction a matter of great difficulty. Many different points are still entirely cut off and have yet to be heard from as to the extent of the damage done.
