

Chief Vickers' Resignation Withdrawn This Morning

Unanimous Request of Commissioners that he should not relinquish Charge of Local Police Force

On the request of the Police Commission this morning Chief W. H. Vickers has withdrawn his resignation as the head of the force. The motion asking the withdrawal was made by Commissioner Hill who stated that he was fully satisfied with the conduct of the chief and his management of the force. Commissioner Myhill-Jones, in seconding the motion, stated certain stock in trade is to be the society.
