Salmon on way to Naas intercepted by Traps on American side; Canadian **Traps Under Construction**

Two salmon traps are being built by the Wales Island Cannery at Dog Fish Bay near the Alaskan boundary off the mouth of the Naas River, and one will be finished by the end of the week. This is the first attempt of the Canadian canneries to offset the lrap fishing on the American side of the boundary.

Reports from Ketchikan state that a number of traps are being built and as near the boundary as possible in order to secure White canvas shoes on sale for the American canneries as many as possible of the fish that are on their way to spawn in the Naas River.

> There is grave danger that the waters of the Naas will be depleted of salmon if the present fishing continues. The example of the Fraser river, that once teemed with myriads of salmon, is a case in point and conditions are very similar on the Naas to hose existing in the Fraser.
