Scheme to Give Impetus to Prospecting.

There is always criticism of everything we do if the action is at all of a public nature. We must expect it, and if we do not expect it we shall very surely get it. Yesterday we published an outline of a proposal of the Provincial Government to help. a few returned soldiers and at the same time to give an impetus to mining. Naturally it was held up to public criticism. There were a good many who recognized in it an honest attempt to do something, which is much more than anyone else had done. On the other hand there were the usual batch of surface criticisms that have no meaning, but that are usually uttered whenever anyone attempts to do anything of a constructive nature.

It is true that Prince Rupert directly does not stand to gain much. Our allotment, which has been made according to population, amounts only to two men. Indirectly, however, it may be an advantage to the whole district. It is pretty safe to say that of the fifty men who are sent out, at least half will come to Stewart or Alice Arm or Hazelton, probably more. If they find one mine, it will be worth an immense lot to the country and will reimburse the Government for the whole expenditure through royalties and taxes. If they find nothing, it will have been a training school for 25 men who knew little about prospecting previously, but who then will be equipped with enough knolwedge. of the business to go out alone and possibly teach someone else. The chief idea is to train new prospectors.

Expense is Not Very Great.

The expense of outfitting and keeping the fifty men is not very great. The men get only a dollar and a half, a day for their expenses while actually in the hills.
