Dominion Day
Great Event.

Dominion Day is a day to be remembered by every Canadian. It is the birthday of the Dominion of Canada, when the confederation of the provinces became effective. By the provisions of the British North America Act passed in 1867 the four provinces of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia became one Dominion under the British flag with provision for the entry of other provinces. All have now taken advantage of the offer except Newfoundland, which still remains a crown colony.

Canada Nearly
Independent Republic.

Canada approaches very near to being an independent republic; but in sentiment she is intensely British. The only official connection with Great Britain is the resident governor-general who takes the place of the King here by officiating at important national or social functions and by signing the bills that are passed by Parliament. This signature is necessary before bills become law. There is also a right of appeal from the Canadian courts to the judicial committee of the British Privy Council, but this is falling into disuse and there has been from time to time considerable agitation for the repeal of that provision.

For all purposes of government the Prime Minister of Canada is the head of the administration and he holds his office subject to the will of the House of Commons. As the House of Commons is elected directly by the people, the government is purely democratic and representative. It approaches very close to the ideal, in form, but like all governments it is as good as the people it represents.

Government
Reflects People.

We believe that the Dominion of Canada has as good a form of government as any other country and better than a good many of the republics. It is, however, still far from perfect. It is just as good as the people who elect the representatives to Parliament. The way to improve the Government is to improve the general status of the people, morally, physically and socially.

The people of Canada are a virile people, but we are continually absorbing people from other countries and we have to see to it that these new arrivals are educated in Canadian ideals. This is a great opportunity for such organizations as the Sons of Canada. As a country we have a lot to learn and a great work to do.

Canada's Future
Lies with the People.

The future of Canada lies with the people of Canada. Our country will be what we make it. It is a good thing to hold a celebration and extol the virtues of our nation, but also it is a good thing now and then to be introspective and to see wherein we sometimes fail so that we may better guide our future conduct. We can make of this a great and powerful nation if we have high ideals and live up to them. On the other hand we can drag the name of our country in the mud and make her to stink in the nostrils of the other nations of the world. Which shall we do? Our future is in our own hands.

AT WESTHOLME THEATRE

The story of "Almost a Husband," adapted from Opie Read's widely read novel "Old Ebenezer," is as different from the ordinary run of screen stories as is Will Rogers' personality from that of every other motion picture star. It is a story of small-town life, a masterly blend of humor, drama and pathos. Above all, it is a warmly human story in which human characters do human things. Novelty and surprises abound in "Almost a Husband."

The story tells of Sam Lyman, a homely but shrewd and kindly teacher in Old Ebenezer. At the annual town social the prettiest girl in town and the daughter of the wealthy banker plays in a game of forfeits and is directed to marry the first man who comes through the door. Sam inadvertently opens the door and is forced to go through the mock marriage ceremony with the girl. After the ceremony it is discovered that the law requiring a marriage licence has been repealed and the young clergyman who performed the service has already been ordained. Thus the prettiest girl in town and the homeliest man find themselves legally married.

From this point on, the plot unravels in a highly interesting manner and develops a number of dramatic complications that are well tinged with romantic sentiment and spontaneous humor.



NEXT MONTH NEW SERVICE B.C. TO FRANCE

Pacific to be First Steamer Load
On This Coast for Havre
and Calais.

LONDON, June 30.—The inauguration of the North Pacific Havre-Calais Line, whose steamships will travel via the Panama Canal, will be completed next month, when the mail steamship Pacific (6,500 tons dead weight) will be loaded at Vancouver for French ports. She will be followed by the mail steamship Kron Princess Margarite in August, and thereafter there will be regular sailings every six weeks. The new enterprise will be started by the Johnson Line of Stockholm, which has some 42 ships in commission.

Agent-General.

F. G. Wade, K. G., Agent-General for British Columbia, in speaking of this new line to a representative of the Canadian Gazette, said: "A little over a year ago it was proposed to operate this line from B.C. ports to France, and I at once notified the Provincial Government to that effect, and circulated the Boards of Trade in order that freight might be forthcoming for the new undertaking. In 1912, Henri Moreau, who was agent for the Johnson Line in French ports, started the Montreal-Calais line, which has proved a great success, and just before the war was bringing to Calais 10,000 tons of goods every month. The inauguration of the line from British Columbia ports to France has been for various reasons postponed, but it is now to become an accomplished fact. I am much interested in the enterprise, for I have been working on the Panama Canal route ever since I came to this office."

Short Route.

The distance from Liverpool to B.C. via Cape Horn, is 14,558 miles. The Panama Canal shortens the distance to 8,892 miles. Before the war it was estimated that a combined freight and passenger steamer, of 8,000 tons gross register, running 14 knots and burning 400 tons of coal daily, would cost to operate about \$750 a day. By using the Panama Canal the saving of such a vessel from Liverpool would be 5,666 nautical miles, that is about 17 days' steaming, or \$12,750, less canal dues. At present prices the saving on every ship would be much greater.

Work is now under way in the clearing of the 100 by 300 yds. space on Central Avenue, Fort George, which will serve as a landing place for the American air service aeroplanes.

An interesting farming operation has been experimented upon at Six Mile Meadow. Mr. Sensabaugh is engaged in a demonstration of plowing the land to the depth of twelve inches with a deep-tilling disc plow.

Ingersoll E. Haight was here last week as representative of the Federal Transportation Company which operates a small boat from Peace River Crossing to Hudson's Hope. According to Mr. Haight the country is opening up with surprising rapidity. A new steamboat is in course of construction at Peace River Crossing and will be brought into commission soon.

A Serbian Society has been organized, with Peter Pavich as President.

The members of the Vancouver Board of Trade will visit here this summer and will go by car to Summit Lake. The return journey will be made down the Crooked, Pack and Paisup Rivers to the Peace River and then to Edmonton by the E.D. & B.C. railway.

LONDON, June 30.—There can be no question of the serious nature of the situation which has arisen through the deficiency in the world's production of sugar and the increased consumption in America following the enforcement of Prohibition. Cuban quotations, chiefly as a result of American buying, irrespective of price, have risen to a level which would necessitate a retail charge in this country of 1s. 9d. a pound if it were not for stocks bought by the Sugar Commission before the recent phenomenal advances took place.

By the system of rationing in this country consumption has been reduced to the extent of about 700,000 tons in the year, but this economy is more than negatived by the increased demand for sugar in the United States. The world production of sugar for 1920 is estimated at 15,300,000 tons, as compared with 18,700,000 tons in 1914. The cane sugar output of Cuba for the season 1919-1920 is put at 3,700,000 tons, as against 3,950,000 tons in 1918-19. The Java figures for the same years show a fall from 1,749,000 tons to 1,335,000 tons.

Excluding Holland, Italy, and Central Europe, which are self-supporting in their sugar production, the European and American requirements for the present season may be regarded approximately as follows:
