GERMANS ARE HEADING FOR WARSAW -- ZEPPELIN DESTROYED BY ACCIDENT

KETCHIKAN WON BOTH BALL GAMES

Ketchikan won both ball games yesterday. In the first game the home team stood 1 to 0 until the seventh inning, when the visitors scored 5 runs, including a home-run by Wally. Prince Rupert has reason to be proud of this young player, as he was raised right here and has never seen baseball played anywhere else.

GERMAN TROOPS RUSHED TO EASTERN FRONT—VON MACKENSEN PUSHING ON TO VISTULA AND BUG RIVERS—ARTILLERY ACTIVE ON WESTERN FRONT—ZEPPELIN EXPLODES

London, July 2.—In a determined effort to gain a decisive victory over the Russians, including the capture of Warsaw, the Germans are rushing troops to the eastern front.

DOMINION DAY

Yesterday, the Dominion of Canada celebrated its forty-eighth birthday, marking the close of the most eventful year of its history, and the opening of an equally momentous one.

Never before has the natal day of Canada been so gloriously celebrated. In the trenches in Flanders and France, and in the hospitals of France and England, the boys of the first and second contingents will have honored the day, as they have honored the Dominion.

The year ahead is full of uncertainty, but one thing is certain, so long as Prussian militarism remains unconquered, Canada's sons will come forward to take the places of those who have fallen in the fight for liberty.

WINNIPEG COMMISSION

An application has been made by fourteen Conservative members of the present Legislative Assembly of Manitoba for such an enlargement of the scope of the Commission now investigating charges of corruption in connection with the contract for the erection of the new Parliament buildings as would enable the Commissioners to inquire into an alleged arrangement between the Roblin government and the Liberal opposition, said to have been entered into for the purpose of shielding the accused parties from a thorough investigation.

sion questioned whether they had power to carry on such an investigation under the present Commission unless the applicants could produce such an agreement as they suspected the managers of the two parties to have entered into.

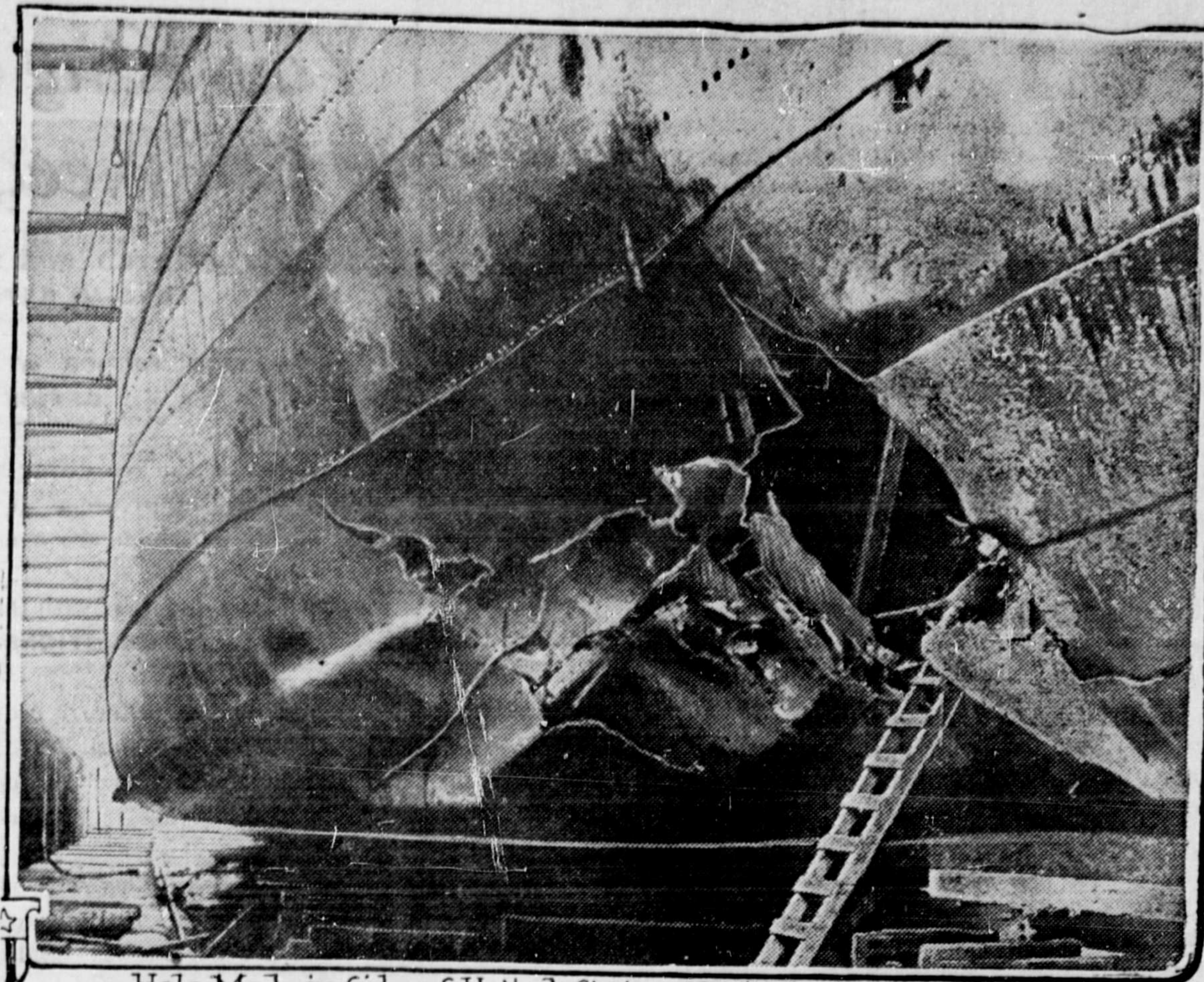

The train due here at 6.15 p. m. Wednesday did not arrive until 5 a. m. Thursday.

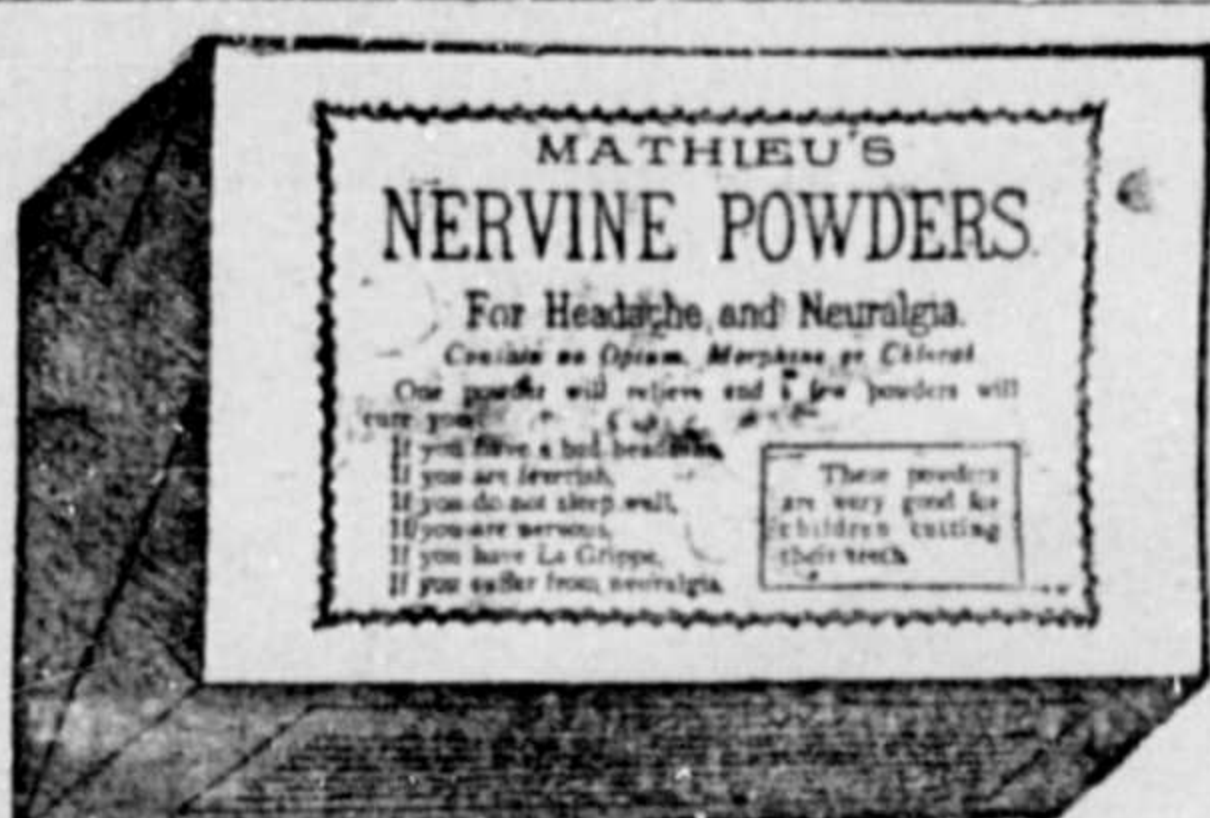
Judge Robertson came in from Prince George and left for Vancouver on the George yesterday.

RECRUITING OFFICE AT PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OFFICE NOW OPEN.

In view of the recruiting which is in progress at present throughout the Province, it is apropos to answer a few of the questions which are considered by those who contemplate entering the Service. The following is a list of pertinent queries, together with the information which each elicits.

QUESTIONS ANSWERED.

- 1.—How long am I to serve? Until the end of the war and six months after if required.
- 2.—What pay shall I receive? Your pay as a private will be \$1.00 per day and 10 cents field allowance. Besides this you will be clothed, equipped and subsisted by the Government.
- 3.—What will my wife receive during my absence? Every month there will be paid her a separation allowance of \$20 (also part of your pay) and if this be not enough to comfortably maintain your family, the Canadian Patriotic Fund will further assist them.
- 4.—What will happen if I am wounded or sick? You will be cared for by the Government and your pay continued until you are discharged. If you are permanently disabled an allowance will be paid you, varying according to the extent of your injury or disability.
- 5.—What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide an adequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the children are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.
