He states that the government "wants to give everyone a chance," but he carefully passes over the hundred chances to one which the speculator has been given, in preference to the genuine producer. The figures quoted in "The Crisis" are not Moses Cotsworth's, but official figures taken from the records at Victoria, and these records show clearly that huge tracts of the most fertile land in the province have been handed over to capitalists, in order that these gentlemen may reap a rich har-

mission, and though Mr. Parker Williams, M. L. A., secured an order of the house on February 19, 1915, for a return showing the complete answers, the return was never made.
