HOW RUSSIA HAS ACTED AS PROTECTOR

Autocratic Russia has been the creator and protector of more small nations than any other government in Europe, and shown less self-interest in its work than any other nation.

> Russia broke the yoke of the Turk over Roumania. Indeed, the Crimean war was precipitated by Russian interference to protect the Roumanians, when a revolt in that country had been put down and the Turks were punishing the Roumanians with their usual bitter severity. France and England united to protect Turkey at this time, but as a result of the peace following the Crimean war Roumania was given autonomy under a native prince, which subsequently ripened into actual independence.

So with Serbia and with Bulgaria, each gaining independence by aid of Russian arms and protected by Russia against the invasion of other powers.

Russia entered this war in protection of Serbia. How did the others of the small nations set up neutral, waiting apparently to
