NO POLITICS







In view of the recruiting which is in progress at present throughout the Province, it is apropos to answer a few of the questions which are considered by those who contemplate entering the Service. The following is a list of pertinent queries, together with he information which each elicits.

QUESTIONS ANSWERED.

1.- How long am I to serve? Until the end of the war and six months after if required.

2 .- What pay shall I receive? Your pay as a private will be \$1.00 per day and 10 cents field allowance. Besides this you will be clothed, equipped and subsisted by the Government.

3.—What will my wife receive during my absence? Every month there will be paid her a separation allowance of \$20. (also part of your pay) and if this be not enough to comfortably maintain your family, the Canadian Patriotic Fund will further assist them.

4. What will happen if I am wounded or sick? You will be cared for by the Government and your pay continued until you are discharged. If you are permanently disabled an allowance will be paid you, varying according to the extent of

your injury or disability. 5.-What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide anadequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the childhen are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.

Murphy, who was lying on the street-,asked for help. He took hold of Murphy's arm when Ohara came running back with a knife and witness ran, Ohara following.

Cross Examined.

Cross examined by Mr. Shoebotham, witness said that Kameda went round the counter and did not jump over it. He did not see Nagano drive the blow home. When Pitman ran away, Ohara and Nagano followed him.

Cross examined by Mr. Patmore witness said he was sure that Kameda had a cleaver. When Nagano swung round he had the knife raised above his head. He brought the knife down in the direction of Pitman. He clearly saw the blood on Nagano's left arm after he had swung the knife.

Charles Glacy said that he lived near the cafe. People running past the house on the night of July 30th woke him up. He saw a man lying on the street, but thought it was a drunk. Kameda came past flashing a light, and asked him where the police were.
