





will further assist them. 4.-What will happen if I am wounded or sick? You will be cared for by the Government and your pay continued until you are discharged. If you are permanently disabled an allowance will be paid you, varying according to the extent of

your injury or disability. 5 .- What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide an adequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the childhen are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.
