The demand of the world today is for ships, and there is a possibility that Prince Rupert is going to benefit by that demand. As a result of the war, anything that will hold a cargo and will float has been enhanced in value to several times its former price. Throughout the world, bottoms are not to be had, with the result that American shipyards which have been vacant for decades are now working night and day. At the present time eighty-two merchant ships are in course of construction on the American Atlantic seaboard, and there is big business for many more, the moment they are ready for sea. Charters are being snapped up at prices which show; a profit to the shipowner which two years ago would made him rub his eyes. Charters which formerly fetched from \$6,000 to \$8,000 are now being grabbed at \$25,000.

4 .- What will happen if I am wounded or sick? You will be cared for by the Government and your pay continued until you are discharged. If you are permanently disabled an allowance will be paid you, varying according to the extent of

your injury or disability. 5 .- What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide an adequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the childhen are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.
