> Word has just reached town from Captain H. A. Philpott, formerly of Prince Rupert and now holding a captain's commission in an English regiment. He states that all is quiet at his section of the western front, but that everything is ready to the last button to withstand any German attempt at an advance.

A thorough enquiry into the causes of the fire is to be held. The inquest will take place on Thursday, February 17th.
