GERMAN WARSHIP MINED IN THE CATTEGAT

RUMANIANS WILL JOIN THE ALLIES -- RUSSIAN SCOUT FIRES 40 GERMAN MINES

LARGE GERMAN WARSHIP SUNK IN THE BALTIC

Warship Believed to Have Struck a Mine off Swedish Coast. Hun Activity on the Western Front.

(Special to The Daily News.)

Copenhagen, Feb. 7.—A large German warship has been sunk in the Cattegat, the entrance to the Baltic from the North Sea, between the Island of Anholt and the coast of Sweden.

It is believed that the warship struck a mine and foundered. Wireless calls for help were picked up, but these suddenly ceased, which points to the fact that the ship went under.

German Activity.

London, Feb. 7.—The Teutons are massing large bodies of troops on the western front, in preparation for a new offensive.

Russian Successes.

Petrograd reports that the Russian successes in Galicia and in the Caucasus continue.

RUMANIAN ARMY ON HUNGARIAN-BULGAR BORDER

Rumanian Army Ready to Join the Allies—Berlin Demands that Neutrality be Observed and Army Disbanded.

(Special to The Daily News.)

Rome, Feb. 7.—The Rumanian army is now ready to join the Allies against the Central Powers in the Balkans. Over half a million Rumanian troops are now massed on the Bulgarian-Hungarian frontiers.

Berlin Demands.

Berlin has notified Rumania that it regards its acts as hostile, and demands that she observe a neutrality favorable to the Central Powers, with total demobilization of the army.

Artillery Being Moved.

On the western frontier, the Rumanian and Hungarian trenches are only fifty yards apart. Heavy artillery is being removed from the Rumanian Black Sea ports to new fortifications on the Hungarian and Bulgarian borders.

THE PRESENT WAR IN BIBLE PROPHECY

(By Mrs. H. R. Grant.)

The following is the address delivered by Mrs. Hugh R. Grant at the last meeting of the Fortnightly Club, and which proved so interesting as to warrant reproduction here.

Esdras, being filled with fear, prays to be shown the interpretation of this fearful vision of the last times.

This is the interpretation: "The Lion which thou sawest in the kingdom which was seen in the vision of thy brother Daniel, but it was not expounded unto him, therefore now I declare it unto thee. Behold the days shall come that there shall rise up a kingdom on earth, and it shall be reared above all the kingdoms which were before it." The angel then explains the meaning of the feathers, wings and heads, which represent the small kingdoms conquered by the kingdom under the emblem of the Eagle, the heads typifying the most important kings, which are gradually destroyed, conquered and eaten up by the Eagle at different periods, till he comes to the "two feathers under the wing, passing over the head, that is on the right side, which the angel explained was the small kingdom and full of trouble (probably Belgium by the position indicated), the destruction of which by the Eagle was the cause of the Lion rising out of the wood roaring and speaking to the Eagle, rebuking her for her unrighteousness." The Lion, the angel explains, is "The Anointed" which the Highest has kept for them and their wickedness till the end. He shall reprove them and upbraid them for their cruelty. TEUTON FORCES CONCENTRATING ON GREEK FRONT

French Aviators Report Massing of German Troops—Bulgars Cross Border—Greek Reservists Called.

(Special to The Daily News.)

Athens, Feb. 7.—French aviators, who have been scouting over the enemy's lines in the Balkans, report that the concentration of the Teuton forces on the Greek frontier continues, troops being massed at Gieveli, Monastir and Tehevikoue.

The Bulgarian forces are leaving Nish with heavy artillery for the Greek frontier.

Bulgarians in Greece.

Athens further reports that three divisions of Bulgarian troops have crossed the Greek frontier to engage the French forces.

Greek Reservists Called.

Two divisions of Greek reservists have been called to the colors.

GERMAN MUSICIAN IS ARRESTED AT WINGHAM

Wingham, Ont., Feb. 7.—Adolphe Schatte, a member of the Wingham band, has been arrested on an order from the Dominion police, following the arrival of a box of cordite in a car over the Grand Trunk Railway.

Schatte is suspected of espionage. Plans of public buildings and bridges were found amongst his effects.

FORTY GERMAN MINES FIRED BY RUSSIAN SCOUT

Clever Work by Russian Scout on Riga Front—Berlin Aerodrome and Nine Planes Gone—Munitions Exploded.

(Special to The Daily News.)

London, Feb. 7.—A Russian scout on the Riga front discovered a system of enemy mines. He attached the wires of the Russian batteries to the German mines and exploded forty of them.

Aerodrome burned.

Geneva reports the destruction by fire of the Johannistal aerodrome at Berlin. Nine of the new German aeroplanes were destroyed in the blaze.

Munitions Exploded.

Rome, Feb. 7.—The great Skoda munition factory in Bohemia has been partially destroyed by an explosion, and one hundred and ninety-five workmen killed.

Three buildings were destroyed, including a plant for the manufacture of twelve-inch hydraulic cannon.

Captain Williams and Captain Turnbull, of the White Pass and Yukon Steamship Line, came north on the Prince John this trip. They stopped off at Alert Bay to look over some mining property in which they are interested, after which they will proceed north to prepare for the summer river traffic into Dawson.

David R. Leslie, who went to the front with the first Prince Rupert contingent, has had a severe nervous breakdown, but is now in the trenches again.

BY-ELECTIONS

At last the people of British Columbia have been informed when the legislature is to meet, though the exact date of the by-elections is still withheld. Bowser and his men are the representatives of the people only in the sense that they were elected by the people. Once elected, they become representatives of the Conservative party only, with the sky as the limit in regard to handling the affairs of the province for the party.

Report places the date of the by-elections as from the 19th to the 23rd of February, and it would be a typical Bowser scheme to hold the elections on different days during that time, beginning with what is supposed to be the strongest Tory camp and then going on to the others. In this way, the Tory headquarters staff and artillery could be trained on three different fronts on three different occasions as it were.

The running of the elections on different days will give other advantages which the Conservative machine would not hesitate to take a chance on, judging from its past performances.

Hon. A.C. Flumerfeldt has already made his bow to the Conservatives in Victoria, on which occasion he waxed eloquent on the fact that the Romans devoted much attention to road building, this by way of trying to justify the pawing of the province to fill the coffers of the Mackenzie-Mann outfit. Mr. Flumerfeldt must have delighted the heart of the proprietor of the Colonist in his airship flights through the realms of history. Incidentally, what the Romans did in Britain and what Bowser and his friends have done in British Columbia have nothing in com-

mon, but the speech served its purpose, in that it covered up thoroughly the real issues of the election.

Hon. C. E. Tisdall has a much harder row to hoe than the representative of the big corporations, as, in his absence in the north on a news gathering expedition, M. A. Macdonald has been unkind enough to rake up a few little items from the recent history of the province, showing how Mr. Tisdall was one of the gentlemen who was "lined up" (as Bowser aptly puts it) by the Dominion Trust Company. Bowser, in his efforts to shed as much responsibility for the vast loss incurred by the depositors in this alleged bank, let some of his friends in rather badly. However, Mr. Tisdall will have ample opportunity to explain what the "lining up" amounted to and why he was so pliant a tool in the hands of the late Mr. Arnold. It will be a merry election, and if the Tories do not manage to hide all the truth about the various adventures they have had in the past few years, there will still be three vacancies in the cabinet on March 2nd.

The descendants of Esau are known to us as Turks. In the Bible they are spoken of as Edom, Mount Seir and Idumea. In the year 1000 A. D. there was

not a Turk in European Turkey or Asia Minor. The Turks had not yet been able to surmount the great natural obstacle of the Euphrates River. They had moved westward from Central Asia, but their advance was stopped by this great river. At this point of their career, the Bible throws light on the situation. In Revelation, 9-14 and 15, is recorded the commission of the sixth trumpet angel to "Loose the four angels which are bound in the great River Euphrates." "And the four angels were loosed to stay the third of men." The four angels as history shows us, were the four great leaders of the Turkic, Tartar or Ottoman hosts. Their invading armies surmounted the river and overflowed Western Asia and across the Bosphorus, even to Vienna. From this high-water mark, they, (in fulfillment of prophecy) receded. (Rev. 16-12). "And the sixth angel poured out his vial upon the great river and the water thereof was dried up that the way of the kings of the east might be prepared." Turkey as an empire had been "drying up" for some years Hungary, Croatia, Transylvania, Montenegro, Greece, Servia, Albania, Roumania, Bulgaria, Macedonia, part of Armenia, part of Arabia, Algiers, Tripoli and Egypt have been successfully liberated from Turkish rule and now the Allies are preparing to drive the Turks out of Europe and take Constantinople.

Turkey's destruction was the sign of the end of this age and the beginning of the next age, or time to expect the second advent of Christ. This was shown by the angel to Esdras as already explained, and Christ, in answering the question to his disciples as to the sign of the end, said "Where the carcass is there will the eagles be gathered together." No one will deny that Turkey is the carcass of Europe. He has been called the "sick man of Europe," and just note the banners of the warring nations around Constantinople to see the eagles as spoken of by the Lord. The warning of the "carcass and the eagles" shows that we are in the most important era in the world's history. The latter part of this era we are just leaving, ever since 1882 when Germany, Austria and Italy formed the Triple Alliance, has been a fulfillment of the prophecy of Joel 3-9. "Proclaim ye among the Gentiles; prepare for war: wake up the mighty men. Let all men of war draw near; let them come up. Beat your plowshares into swords, and your pruning hooks into spears. Let the weak say 'I am strong.' Assemble yourselves and come all

ye heathen, and gather yourselves together round about; thither cause Thy mighty ones to come down, Oh Lord. Let the heathen be awakened and come up to the Valley of Jehoshaphat, for there will I sit to judge all the heathen round about."

Now we know that for years the Gentiles, or people on the continent of Europe, have been steadily and persistently preparing for war. They have been "waking up their mighty men." Lately, all the men of war (their armies) have been made to "come up" or join the colors. They have assembled in vast hosts all over Europe. Especially in Germany and Austria has this preparation for war been going on. And please note that while this preparation for war has been going on, that Britain (Israel), has been working for peace, or avoidance of war, doing all in her power to stop the armament going on in Europe.

This preparation by the Gentiles and the fighting in Europe is but the prelude to the yet greater contest to take place when those armies come up to the Valley of Jehoshaphat, where the true Armageddon will be fought. "The great day of the Lord is near. It is near and hasteth greatly, even the voice of the day of the Lord." The mighty man shall cry there bitterly. of darkness; a day of the trumpet and alarm against the fenced cities and the high towers."
Revelation 16-14 (revised version) seems to indicate two stages of preparation for this "great and terrible day of the Lord." (1) The gathering together of the kings of the earth to battle. (2) The gathering of the whole world to battle. The "earth," in the Apocalypse, always means the territories once belonging to ancient Rome. This war began with Austria, Germany, Belgium, France and Russia. These belong to the expression "the earth," but we see the war has spread beyond "the earth," and now includes almost the whole world. Japan is included, Britain's territories, Australia, Canada, etc., are included, and before the Turks are crushed, we are told that "all Israel" (including the United States) will be in the war. We are just at the "beginning of sorrows," as spoken of by Christ.

The word translated "battle" in the original means not "one battle," but a series of battles, stretching over years, with probably intervals of peace, until the culmination in reached in Palestine in the "great and terrible" battle of Armageddon. Such then is the prospect before the earth. World-wide conflict of unparalleled magnitude, and unexampled ferocity and slaughter, covering possibly many years. Jesus said, in speaking of this period, that "This generation shall not pass away till all these things be fulfilled." The dates given by students of the Pyramid give this period as lasting twenty years. The object God has in all this is "to gather the nations to the battle of that great and terrible day of God Almighty." (Rev. 16-14).

That "great day" is the second advent of our Lord, and we must

(2) Validating Bylaw No. 243 of said City; being "a bylaw for the purpose of authorising the renewal of certain treasury certificates and for issuing an additional amount of such certificates," and authorising the issue of bonds on the said Annuity Instalment or Serial plan for the \$100,000 mentioned in Bylaw 243 for a term of more than 30 years and also to ratify Bylaw 245, relating to such debentures; both without submission to the ratepayers.

(3) To provide for temporarily financing all said bonds by authorising the issue, renewal or reissue of temporary notes for not more than five (5) years from the date of such issue, renewal or reissue, pending the sale of the bonds heretofore mentioned and making provision for the payment of any loss which may be made on the sale of such temporary notes, renewals or reissue thereof.

(4) To provide for collecting instalments both for principal and interest before bonds have actually been sold. Such instalments so far as principal is concerned to be applied to reduce amount of treasury certificates or temporary notes then outstanding or to be issued.

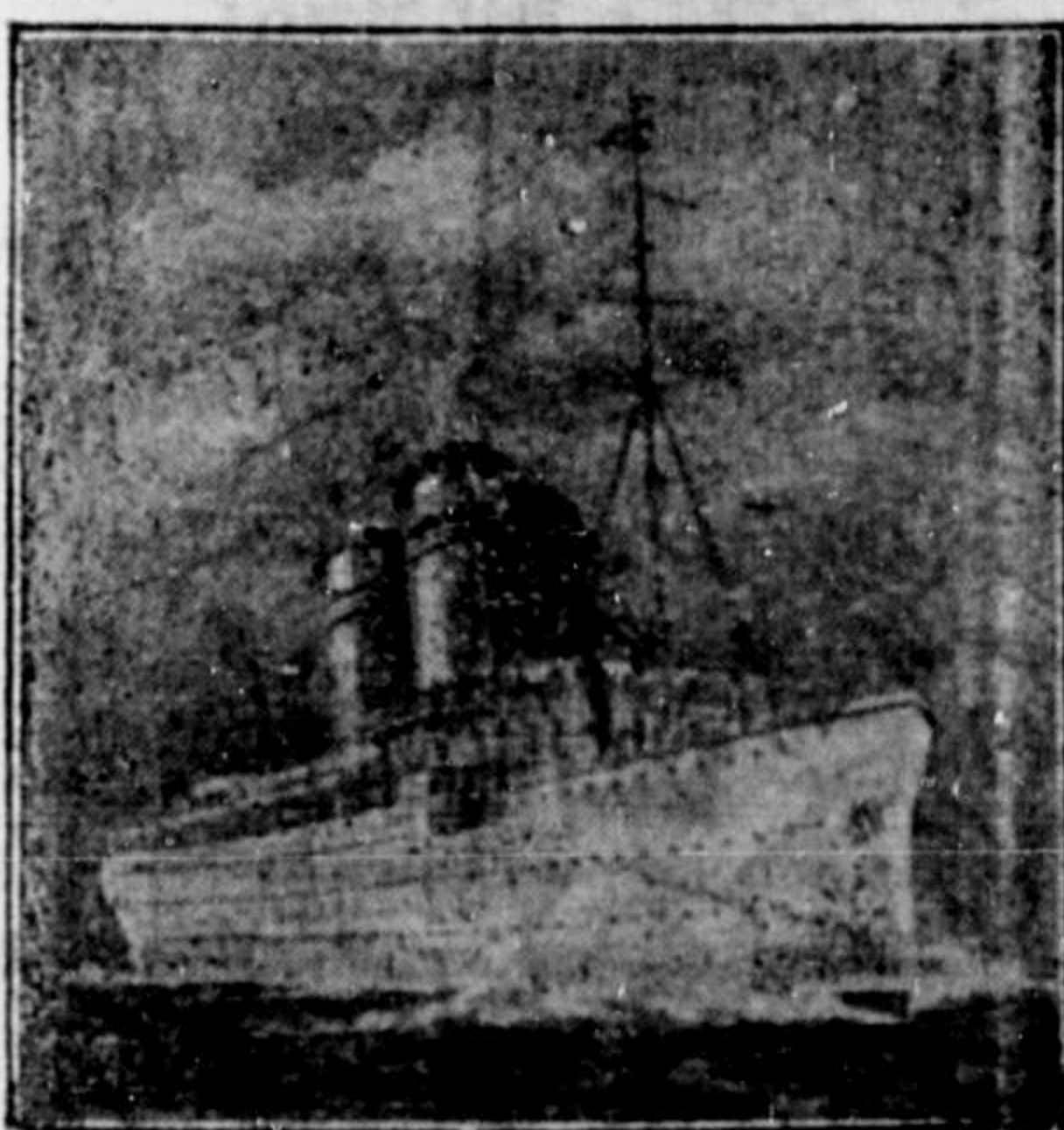

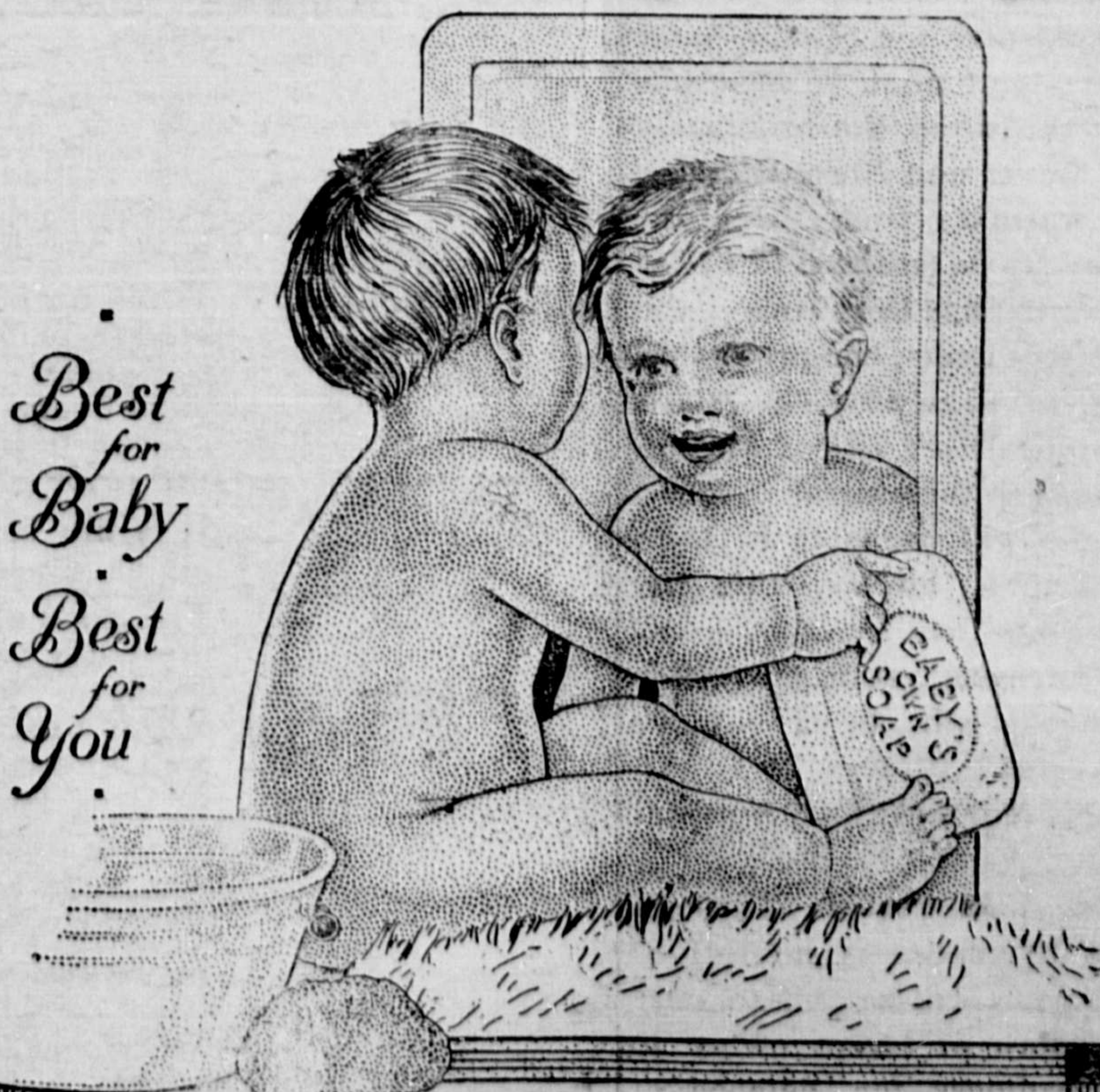
RECRUITING OFFICE AT PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OFFICE NOW OPEN.

In view of the recruiting which is in progress at present throughout the Province, it is apropos to answer a few of the questions which are considered by those who contemplate entering the Service. The following is a list of pertinent queries, together with the information which each elicits.

QUESTIONS ANSWERED.

- 1.—How long am I to serve? Until the end of the war and six months after if required.
- 2.—What pay shall I receive? Your pay as a private will be \$1.00 per day and 10 cents field allowance. Besides this you will be clothed, equipped and subsisted by the Government.
- 3.—What will my wife receive during my absence? Every month there will be paid her a separation allowance of \$20 (also part of your pay) and if this be not enough to comfortably maintain your family, the Canadian Patriotic Fund will further assist them.
- 4.—What will happen if I am wounded or sick? You will be cared for by the Government and your pay continued until you are discharged. If you are permanently disabled an allowance will be paid you, varying according to the extent of your injury or disability.
- 5.—What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide an adequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the children are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.

THE PRESENT WAR IN BIBLE PROPHECY

remember the note of warning given us to be ready. "Watch therefore, for ye know not the day nor the hour your Lord cometh." (Matt. 24-22). "Behold I come as a thief. Blessed is he that watcheth and keepeth his garments." Now although many are watching, there is really no deep research on this subject. We seldom hear Christ's coming spoken of from the pulpit. Prophecy says there shall be a revival or an awakening shortly along this line.

When we see wars extending to the whole world, we may expect Christ any time to come for His Bride, the church. First will come the resurrection of the Blessed dead, and, almost at the same time, those living who are His own will be caught up into the air with the blessed dead. Now that may mean that those of us who are living and belong to Christ, will escape the "great and terrible day of the Lord," and all the tribulation spoken of by Christ, by being caught up in safety, just as Noah was shut away from the flood, because we are told in Luke 21-36 to "pray that we may be counted worthy to escape these things which are coming on the earth and to stand before the Son of Man."

I would not attempt to set any dates or to say when this battle of Armageddon will be, or to say just the time that Christ will come. Christ said "No man, not even the Son, knoweth as it is locked up in the heart of the Father," but He gave certain signs whereby those waiting and watching might know the end, and, to the students of this subject, apparently these signs are present now and this great war is one of them.

During this period we are entering upon, Britain, as the Israel of God, is to be engaged in war, as an instrument in God's hand, to bring about what we have had foretold in Esdras, the destruction of the Eagle, and the dominance of the world by God. Also, the Jews have to be restored to Palestine by Israel and they are to dwell there safely under her protection. (Ezekiel 37-45 to 28). The Turks, after being driven out of Europe, will establish themselves in Syria. Damascus will probably be their headquarters. So far, this city of Damascus has never been utterly destroyed, yet it is written "Damascus will be a ruinous heap." (Isa. 17-1). This will happen at Turkey's final destruction.

Daniel 4-42 reveals Turkey's attempt to repossess himself of Egypt. They will be able to seize the treasure of Egypt owing to the unreadiness for defence of Egypt by Britain, but, finally, Turkey will be troubled with the tidings of their "hastening out of the north and out of the east to give battle," and will retreat, but too late. Turkey as a nation will then receive her death blow,

and Damascus will become a ruinous heap and "Egypt above Cairo will become a desolation." (Joel 3-19). Then British Israel and the Jews will regain full possession of Palestine. Meanwhile, the nation of "Rosh" (Ezekiel 38, R. V.) will be getting the mastery in Europe, so that all the continental nations may be under his confederacy, and they will make an attack on Palestine led by that proud Assyrian, the Anti-Christ, a man of wonderful powers, able to work miracles and who will deceive even some of the elect. This will be Armageddon.

If this is true, it ought to make us as a British people, very proud that we are the instrument in God's hand to bring about His purposes, and we ought to look upon these wars, not as a means of enhancing our glory, but the bringing about of God's designs in the world, and it ought to make us humbly proud and more able to see the deep meaning lying in this scripture "Not by might nor by power, but by my spirit, said the Lord God of Hosts."

YOU'VE met at least one of those few good old souls, who are constantly getting the worst of it when shopping, who don't believe in advertising. A hundred disappointing and instructive experiences have failed to teach him their plain lesson.
