London, March 6 .- The Russian thousand Armenians who had enlisted in the Russian ranks, took a terrible revenge on the Turks for the massacre of Armenian women and children by the Ottoman soldiers at Van and Mush.

The Russians refused quarter and exterminated the entire Turkish Third Army.

In Constantinople.

At Constantinople, the Turkish women threw silver in front of the relief trains, imploring that their husbands be not sent to certain death at the hands of the Russians.

Mesopotamia.

There is heavy fighting reported in Mesopotamia, where the British relief column has been heavily reinforced and is advancing against the Turks at Kut-El-Amara.

Turks Revolt.

Revolt has broken out in Smyrna where Turkish soldiers have attacked their German officers.

Air Raid.

Three Zeppelins raided the northeast coast of England last night, when twelve persons were killed and thirty-three injured.





5 .- What will be done for my wife and children if I die while on Active Service? The Government will provide an adequate pension, that will enable the family to live comfortably until the childhen are old enough to look after themselves. The widowed mother of a single man, if the son be her sole support, is treated in the same way as a wife.


