The evidence in the enquiry showed that Mr. Weish's landlord toid him that the gang had been herded in rooms over Weish's store early in the morning of the election.

Mr. Welsh admitted receiving a letter from John L. Suilivan in Seattle and also admitted that he was careful enough to destroy that incriminating doc_ ument and to forget all that it contained. He claimed that Sullivan sent him wireless messages "warning him" of what was taking place. The wireless messages were produced at the enquiry and were found to be very different from what Mr. Weish stated on oath They were UNSIGNED messages, yet Mr. Weish required no enlightenment as to the sender. He was expecting them.
