What Does Organized Labor Say **About The B. C. Prohibition Act?**

RESOLUTION OF VANCOUVER TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL Adopted at Meeting of July 20th.

"Resolved-That the Trades and Labor Council of Vancouver, B. C., in harmony with representative bodies of organized labor elsewhere, place itself upon record as opposed to the 'British Columbia Prohibition Act' and to the principle involved therein."

RESOLUTION OF NEW WESTMINSTER TRADES COUNCIL Adopted at Meeting of June 14th.

"Resolved-That this Council go on record as opposed to Prohibition as contained in the present Bill, from an economic and social standpoint, and report this decision to the various unions with the request that they help to defeat the present measure."

Resolutions of a similar character to the above have been passed by the Victoria Trades and Labor Council and the Prince Rupert central labor organization.
