WASHINGTON IS EMBROILED IN NAVAL DEBATE

British Writers Assert that the United States Should have Refused to Countenance Submarine Campaign.

(Special to The Daily News)

London, October 11.- Naval writers maintain that the United States government cannot fairly countenance the carrying of the German submarine campaign into territory adjacent to the home waters of that country, after having registered a protest to the British government against the patrolling of British cruisers near the American coast, in watching for the submarine Deutschland.

UNIFORMS

The long-expected blow has fallen and the Canadian honorary colonels may no longer pose as real soldiers, at least in England. This should have happened long ago, but better late than never. Probably the army tailor had something to do with the order, though his brother, the Bond Street provider of fancy uniforms and cocked hats, will never forgive him. It is stated that the casualties amongst tunics was frightful and a rigid investigation showed that the fractures were mostly discovered after a soldier had been in London on furlough. The injuries were confined to the seams under the arms, which were generally strained or even burst and, in extreme cases, there was a tired feeling in the arms and the patients showed a marked disinclination to attempt to raise either arm above the head, as in brushing the hair.

It is apparent that what the boys were saluting was not the colonels but their uniforms and that they might just as well have been touching their caps to uniforms displayed in the store windows. This is a highly interesting subject and, had Thomas Carlyle been still to the fore, it might have brought forth a new Sartor Resartus, the sentences in which would have been rather vitriolic.

Even in Canada, the honorary colonels should not be allowed to wear the uniform of a colonel. A uniform denotes the rank of its wearer and it is ridiculous to suggest that a gentleman who has probably never rendered a service to his country, but merely to his party, should be allowed to proclaim to the world that he is on a par with a man who has led a host into battle and has faced the fire of the enemy. The whole business is a farce and would provide ample material for a score of comic operas of the Gilbert & Sullivan type. If the honorary colonels felt that they must wear their feathers, they might have had the sense to remain at home where they would not run any risks of being mistaken for soldiers.






