Bob Rogers' chickens are coming home to roost, as chickens will, and it is particularly unfortunate for Sir Robert Borden that he allowed himself to be forced to admit the "election wizard" of Manitoba to his cabinet.

The report of Mr. Justice Galt regarding the kind of evidence given by Mr. Rogers before the commission of enquiry into the construction of the Manitoba Agricultural College requires little comment. 

HARRY LAUDER'S SON KILLED IN ACTION

Captain John Lauder, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, son of Mr. Harry Lauder, the wellknown comedian, has been killed in action. He had been wounded twice previously. He became engaged to be married before he went back to the trenches. He was educated in the City of London School, and was at Cambridge when war broke out. He had taken his B.
