INDIAN RULER HONORED

Turks in great confusion are again retreating from Ayiziyah, which lies fifty-two miles west of Kut. Since December, the British have taken over seven thousand prisoners and since the fall of Kut. over 4,300 prisoners, 28 guns, 19 trench mortars, and 11 machine guns have been captured. The Turks were very well supplied with ammunition of all kinds and they have been compelled to leave very large quantities behind in their flight. Three Turkish gunboats, ten barges and thirty pontoons have also been taken. The British cavalry are operating to the north of the retiring enemy and their apparent object is to intercept the Turkish forces. Western Front.
