



RUSSIA'S CONQUEST

To grasp the full significance of Russia's conquest of herself, the greatest victory in her history, it is worth while recalling the events which led to the epochal convulsion of the last few days. The Russian Parliament, consisting of the Duma, or Lower, House, and the Council of the Empire, was the product of the revolutionary disturbances which followed the war with Japan. An elective body, it was permitted to enjoy only the shadow of authority. The group of reactionaries, or apostles of despotism, who surrounded the Czar an' who up to the recent startling developments completely dominated him, took good care to retain the substance. Thus parliament was little better than a debating society. It had nothing to say in the administration of the army and navy or in matters of policy. The control of legislation was in the hands of ministers who were not responsible to it.
