

THE CIVIL SERVICT BILL

The Civil Service Bill, introduced in the Legislature last week "is one of the most important measures ever submitted for the consideration of the law-makers of this province," says the Victoria Times. "It is the product of careful thought and inquiry, in which the government had the benefit of the expert counsel of Dr. Adam Shortt, of the Dominion Civil Service Commission, who generously gave his services without charge. The bill follows closely the Federal legislation of 1908, but relatively goes further, as it covres certain branches of what is known as the outside service. Like the Dominion Act, the new measure classifies the service by divisions, wich in turn are divided into grades, maximum and minimum remuneration being fixed for each. It makes special provision for persons of technical or professional experience as well as for deputy ministers, whose appointments are subject to the control of the Government, which also retains the power to fix their salaries.

"The measure will be administered by a commissioner who will have the rank of a deputy minister and who will be removable by only the Legislature. He must give his undivided attention to the work. His duty will be to test and pass upon the qualifications of candidates for admission to the service, or for promotion in the service, and to supervise examinations and make recommendations for improvements wherever he deemed them necessary to the efficiency of the various branches.
