The capture of this position is likely to force the abandonment of a large portion of the German line.

Further Attacks.

Slightly to the northeast of Hargicourt, the British positions were advanced and to the northeast of the village of Gavrelle strong enemy attacks were repulsed. To the east of Armentieres an enemy raiding party attempted an attack on the British trenches during the night, but most of the party were taken prisoner

(1) urgent questions affecting the prosecution of the war; (2) the possible conditions on which, in agreement with our allies, we could assent to its termination, and (3 the problems which will then immediately arise.


