OFF RETURNS AGAIN TO THE FRONT

RESIGNATION WITHDRAWN AND RENEWAL OF RUSSIAN OFFENSIVE IS PROMISED

ITALIANS ARE ADVANCING

Inhabitants Are Panic Stricken at Rapid Italian Progress-Records are Sent to Vienna.

(Special to The Daily News.) Rome, May 19 .- The Austrian mander has ordered all civilare now only twelve miles distant from the city limits. sitions were made by the Germans, but their intention of driving the French troops back was frustrated

The whole series of the German attacks were repulsed, and very heavy losses were inflicted.

British Front.

London, May 19 .- General Haig reported that to the northeast of Armentieres, two raids were made by the Germans in some strength. The raiding parties were beaten of the fighting around Bullecourt or any other portion of the Hindenburg line.

German Admission.

Berlin, May 19 .- The ruins of the former village of Bullecourt were evacuated according to command, without disturbance from the enemy, who established himself there twenty-four hours later.

THE WAR

The latest information coming from the various fronts show that little by little, on many fronts, the enemies of the Entente nations are being driven back. At no one point are they able to make any permanent progress. On the British and the French fronts in the west, while no great territorities have been captured during the last few days, at several distinct points, propress has been made, a few yards at a time, but always at the expense of the enemy. The German General Staff have thrown reserves into the front line in despairing efforts to stem the pressure exerted by the Allies, and at times have attempted a counter offensive over a wide front, but it has been unable to move the Allied

Notwithstanding the transfer of thousands of his troops from the eastern theatre to the west. Hindenburg has seen the Allies "nibble" at his "line," reinforced as it is. The Allies have now got the upper hand, and Hindenburg knows it. His great problem seems now to be to get his armies back to the Rhine, without losing them. He is losing them too fast as it is, in cusualties.


