Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective

fre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clear-ing and cultivation of at least 5 acres. before receiving Crown Grant.

Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 1 years, and has made procause of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of im provement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent rest dence may be issued, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained in less than 5 years, and improvements of \$10.00 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence

of at least 2 years are required. Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pro-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company. Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased; conditions include payment of stumpage.
