The acting Commissioner of the High Cost of Living Commission finds that "prices are not justifiable," considering the stocks of beef, ham, bacon, mutton and lamb. This will verify the suspicion which has been at the back of the minds of most people for quite a long time now. The Commissioner says that these prices should forthwith decline. Which is all very well in its way. Very many other things "should" take place, but unfortunately, they don't. Even a recommendation from the High Cost of Living Commission will not cause the price of food stuffs to decline unless some further action compelling such a result is taken. Such a step would hardly be for the Borden Government to take, when its friends are the chief parties interested in the keeping of prices at a high level. And what would the Borden Government do without its own particular friends? On its merits alone, the Borden Government stands condemned. 


