

of hydraulic mining. Ever since the rush of '98 a stream of gold has steadily flowed out of the Atlin District, but the invariable cry is: "Just paying expenses."

When I first visited Atlin twelve years ago there was talk of a railway to be built from Atlin to the sea near Juneau to save the long journey round by Skagway. Nothing has been done in the way of a railway but a beginning has been made on a wagon road to the Canadian boundary on the Taku river, only about sixty miles more is required to complete this road. Motor boats can make their way up from the sea to this boundary. Perhaps after the war our American ally would consider for an exchange, or a sum of money, the ceding of a narrow strip of a few square miles at the head of Taku Inlet and so give us. a Canadian port for the Atlin District, but even without this concession the Atlin people are justly entitled to a wagon road to the boundary. One who has been over this route assures me that a road could be easily made and that it would mean new life to the whole Atlin region.

I spent nearly a fortnight recently in this fascinating district ministering to the spiritual needs of the Protestant community in St. Martin's Church, Atlin, on the Sundays, July 1st and 8th. Many [American tourists joined in our] religious celebration of Dominion Day, singing lustily "Our Loved Dominion Bless with Peace and · Happiness."


