TENDERNESS

A striking example of the tender fashion in which the Borden Government deals with in the Toronto Star in a recent issue. This relates to the proposed income tax, which the Minister of Finance said would yield about the same amount of revenue as that which was received from the present war profits tax, which the new income tax will replace at the end of this year. It has pointed out time and again that the new income tax, those making large profits from the war would pay less into the national treasury than they are at present paying. And a study of the provisions of the proposed income tax confirms this view. It shows that the effect of the proposal is to shift the burden of taxation from the big concerns, who are making the big profits and best able to bear taxation, on to the small investors, the small merchants and the salaried classes of the Dominion.

The Toronto Star presents a comparative table showing the taxes contributed by several well known firms under the present war profits scale and what they will pay under the income tax, which will take its place. The table is as follows:

New Steel Co. of Canada \$308,240 \$149,016 Nova Scotia Steel., 237,252 84,056 Ogilvie Flour 280,255 53,440 Canada Foundries .. 222,368 26,152

The Minister of Finance says that the new income tax will yield about the same amount of revenue as the present war profits tax. This table shows that from the big interests, of which the above are only four. the new tax will yield only a small proportion of the amount which the present war profits tax brought. The question arises, where will the equalizing amount come from? It can only come from the small salaried man, the small merchant and the small investor.






