

#### PROCRASTINATION

Some days ago, Mr. Fred Pardee moved in the Dominion Parliament an amendment to the Income Tax Bill providing that a much larger tax be paid on big incomes. The amendment, of course, had special application to large incomes being harvested from the war, as these are the only incomes being enhanced at this time. It was ruled out of order by the speaker, but before this was done, an illuminating debate developed, the official objections to the proposats of Mr. Pardee being particularly suggestive. The stock argument used by Sir Thomas White and his colleagues every time somebody advocates a fair levy on war profits and incomes, was that if this were done, it would reduce the contributions to the Patriotic Fund and other public funds. The answer to this is so obvious that the argument | must strike everybody as the weakest kind of special plead-


