GERMANS ARE REPULSED IN MOLDAVIA

Germans Suffer Very Heavy Loss -Roumanian Schools Closed Sanguinary Battles on This Front.

(Special to The Daily News.)

London, Sept. 1 .- The great lattle which has lasted a fortf the most sanguinary of the reat war.

It is evident that the Roumanie German losses are incomparoumanians and Russians.

The Roumanian schools have been closed by the Central Powers thus pursuing their well known policy of denationalizing the conquered territory.

Petrograd, Sept. 1 .- The Russians and Roumanians repulsed with heavy losses to the enemy repeated attacks in the region of Cona. Southwest of Lake Marcoz intense fusilades are reported.

Germans After Riga. London, Sept. 1 .- The land attacks by the Germans in an endeavor to smash through the Russian lines and capture Riga have resulted in failure. The Germans are believed to be preparing a combined land and sea offensive
