Ottawa, Sept. 20 .- The pressing need for Democracy and all that Democracy stands for is being urged at the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada now sitting in Convention at Ottawa. The people must be free to dictate in the making of the laws of the country. John Winstone, representing the British working men, speaks of Bonar Law as a patriotic profiteer. He calls the war one of the greatest crimes ever perpetrated on a long-suffering world. The will of the people shall form the foundation for the building of a new edifice of civilization. He was of the opinion that British Labor would eventually attend the Stockholm Conference, despite the attempts of the Government to throw difficulities in the way.


