A REAL THRILLER

History afford no precedents for the situation which has existed in Russia during the last week. The commanderin-chief of a vast army rises in revolt against the Government and marches towards the capital. High officers refuse to take his place. A formidable enemy threatens along a thousandmile front, after just winning a notable success. The armies are without supreme direction. And nothing disastrous happens. The revolt collapses without bloodshed, as far as we can learn. The enemy not only gains no advantage but is pressed back in places. A sensational, hair-raising act in a marvellous drama has a tame ending.

Russia has a habit of surprising, gratifying and dismaying both her friends and foes without warning. When the war began she astonished her Allies and startled the enemy by the swiftness of her mobilization. Instead of abandoning the whole of Poland and falling back upon the Rug river as the Germans fondly expected, she swooped into East Prussia in the north and knocked out Austria's first-line army and conquered almost all of Galicia in the south in a few weeks. When, after her great reverse in 1915, German military authorities declared that she was out of the war for good-a declaration which was; innocently accepted in many quarters in the Entente countries at its face value, an unfortunately common occurrence -she confounded the prophets against Turkey which gave her at \$12. Thousands deserted Committees of soldiers took control from officers. Still Russia kept on her pins. Then came an amazing military revival in Galicia followed by a fearful relapse; next the loss of Riga and finally the Korniloff revolt. And the end of Russia's internal difficulties is a long way off.

The truth is that Russia is of vast potentialities and peopled by nearly two hundred millions, the great majority of whom are close to the soil, her recuperative powers and stamina are inexhaustible. If military commentators would bear those fundamentals in mind they would not indulge in so many rash predictions about the hopelessness of Russia's military prospects. 
