# CROWN PRINCE AGAIN ATTACKS VERDUN VAINLY

French Troops Check the German Rush and Inflict Severe Losses-Other Attacks Also Repulsed.

London, Sept. 25 .- General Petain's troops were successful in repulsing a violent German attack to the northeast of Verdun. Very severe losses were inflicted upon the enemy, who again used his mass formation. His lines simply melted before the intensity of the French fire. Simultaneously, other two attacks were made by the enemy forces north of Bozaneaux, and southeast of Beaument. These attacks were repulsed also.

### DOMINION PARLIAMENT The last session of the

Twelfth Parliament, which has now come to a close, is notable as much for its sins of omission than its sins of commission. In other words, for what it failed to do as for what it did accomplish. The compulsory military service law is the outstanding achievement of this session, and the passing of this Act was made possible only by many Liberal members voting for it, who were favorable to conscription. The enforcing of the Militia Act, however. which was already the law of the land, would have done away with the necessity for this new measure, had the Borden Government seen fit to enforce its provisions. The new Act, however, is the most important legislation dealt with. In adopting the conscription of the manhood of the country, it will serve as a prelude to the application of the principle to all the resources of the nation. Which the Borden Government did not have the necessary strength to do, nor the inclination either.

The only other war measure of importance dealt with is the War Time Election Act, if this can be called a war measure. The Borden Government, however, chooses to so regard it. The majority of the people of Canada will regard it otherwise, and as being merely a desperate device of a discredited Government in fear of the electorate. The measure itself and the manner of its being railroaded through the House are both worthy of the best traditions of Prussianism, This Act can only be classed as a political expedient designed to win the election, not the war. Its results, however, may have the effect of a boomerang.

The cost of the bill introduced to relieve Messrs. Mackenzie & Mann of their obligations in connection with the C. N. R. will be a heavy one to the country. By paying millions of good money furnished by the people of Canada for watered stock, declared by the Government's own commission to be worthless, the Borden Government has shown itself to be representative not of the people, but of the moneyed in-
