Flanders Front. five distinct and separate attacks each attack ended in failure. The attackers were unable to shake the hold of the British troops. The northeast corner of the Polygon Wood was also attacked severely, but the defenders were able to withstand all the pressure brought to bear upon them.

London, Oct. 3 .- The German Supreme Command, apparently alarmed at the success of the Italian drive on the Bainsizza Plateau, have ordered the transfer of a large number of Austrian troops from France, Galicia and the Bukowina to the Italian front to meet the renewed offensive now starting by General Cadorna.



These Boards will examine, free of charge and obligation, all men who wish to be examined as to their physical fitness for military service. They will tell you in a very short time whether your physical condition absolves you from the call or makes you liable for selection.

A certificate of unfitness from a Medical Board will secure for you freedom from responsibility under the Military Service Act from any Exemption Tribunal. A certificate of fitness will not preclude an appeal for exemption on any ground.

In order that you may be able to plan your future with certainty, visit a Medical Board as soon as possible and find out if you are liable to be selected. Your family and your employer are interested as well as yourself.
