

SHOULD FACE THE ISSUE

When the compulsory military service legislation was adopted by Parliament the National Service Board went out of business. In his valedictory R. B. Bennett, the director, declared that the functions and duties of the Board were not clearly enough defined at the outset and added that the initial mistake of the Government was in not making the signing of the cards sent out compulsory. He applied to his own case the words of the Director of National Service in England in regard to a similar condition as follows:

"It is apparent that the rock upon which the department split was the fact that a local habitation and a loud-sounding name was given to it, and then it was launched with a roving commission to discover its functions and duties, but left without any statutory powers and no boundaries delimiting its sphere."

The Canadian National Service Board cost the country hundreds of thousands of dollars, and the result of its oper-! ations was practically nothing. 

This probably explains how the Davies Company made two hundred and fifty per cent profit during one year of the Boer war. The bacon had a number of oceans to cross and doubtless Sir Joseph, in some disguise or other, was waiting at all the strategic spots where another profit might be expected to happen. Incidentally there is a rumor afloat that the bacon Sir Joseph sold to the British army in South Africa was bad. and that a lot of it was condemned. If the Commission had full powers it might inquire into that.

These Men Will Help You Decide

Are you liable to be selected for service under the Military Service Act?

The answer to this question is being made readily available for you. Remember that the first class to be called includes only men between the ages of 20 and 34, both inclusive, who are unmarried or widowers without children, those married after July 6, 1917, being deemed single for the purposes of the Act.

Medical Boards are now being established throughout Canada. These Boards will examine, free of charge and obligation, all men who wish to be examined as to their physical fitness for military service. They will tell you in a very short time whether your physical condition absolves you from the call or makes you liable for selection.

It is important that you obtain this information as soon as possible. A certificate of unfitness from a Medical Board will secure for you freedom from responsibility under the Military Service Act from any Exemption Tribunal. A certificate of fitness will not preclude an appeal for exemption on any ground.

In order that you may be able to plan your future with certainty, visit a Medical Board as soon as possible and find out if you are liable to be selected. Your family and your employer are interested as well as yourself.


