THE FULLEST MEASURE

"To find the men, the money and the resources necessary to ensure the fullest measure of support to our heroic soldiers at the front, and to enable Canada to continue to the very end to do her part to win the war," in the words of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, is the first duty of the Liberal Government. "In this election, the supreme end is to assist in the tremendous struggle in which we are engaged, to maintain the unity of the nation, to avoid the divisions and discords which, for many years kept in check, are now unfortunately again looming up dangerously and threateningly; resolutely to face the economic situation with the view of avoiding and lessening the privations and sufferings which should not exist in a country so richly endowed by nature as our country." Sir Wilfrid Laurier has in-

dicated in no uncertain manser that there are many abuses existing at the present time which require rectification, and that he will rectify them. Sir Wilfrid mentions specifically his condemnation of profiteering and the methods he would institute to deal with it. The very mention of such a radical; change from the policy of the Borden Government, which encouraged profiteering rather than otherwise, is of course quite sufficient to make every profiteer holler for Borden. To a certain extent, this explains the attitude of a number of the local profiteers. On their part, however, it is no new attitude. They have been profiteering and rabid Tories for a long time

It is in the interests of the people of Canada that for every dollar spent in the purchase of war supplies that the Government gets one hundred cents' value. ed. This is of course rank heresy to the big interests, who are able to get Sir Robert Borden and his Finance Minister to run things in Canada in their things going as they would like, it does not matter much for the other eight million inhabitants of the Dominion.

Support for the soldiers overseas is necessary and protection for the people at home against exploitation is none the less so. This latter is one of the things which the Borden Government as a matter of principle, never considers. about. All the protective powers of the Borden crowd are devoted to the interests, the moneyed classes, the National Trust and its financial friends in Toronto and the Canadian Manufacturers Association. So far as the Borden Government is concerned, the people of Canada can look after themselves. They have in the past ance from that direction during

the past six years. Sir Robert Borden as premier, and Sir Thomas White as Minister of Finance would be little more inclined or capable of holding down the exploitation which has been going on in the years past. These men have proved themselves by their past tenure of office to be out in the interests of a small section of the community rather than in the interests of the people of Canada as whole. Judging by what they have done, the people of Canada can have little hope of any improvement in conditions, in any reduction of the high cost of living, or the curtailment of profiteering, are they returned to power again.
