

UNITY

After three years of warfare against the most powerful enemy modern civilization has had to face, the British Empire as a whole is more indissolubly knit together than in any other stage of her history. The oneness with which the constituent parts of the Empire came to the help of the mother country in her time of need is a striking tribute to the soundness of the British idea of government. The Great Britain of three hundred years ago, composed of separate peoples and contained in the group of islands to the northwest of Europe has developed into a nation and a company of nations. In this time of war, their spirit is as one and as one the soldiers of this company of nations stand against the tyranny of an autocratic enemy.

Great Britain herself did not ask for the assistance of her daughter nations. It was given voluntarily. And while she accepted the assistance, which was more than welcome, at no time has she turned to the self governing dominions and said to them that they were not doing enough in the struggle. Being self governing dominions Canada, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand were left to render such assistance as they chose to give. And naturally, the first available help that could be rendered was in men. Thousands of volunteers came from these new Britains across the seas, notwithstanding their distance from the seat of war. and their sparsely populated countries. And neither did the fact that Great Britain had greater reserves of population to draw upon militate against assistance in this form.

But never yet has Great Britain said to her dominions across the seas that they were not doing enough. Even with Ireland, a few miles away, if the Irish people did not come to the assistance willingly, Great Britain did not enforce compulsion. And Ireland was under the same government and even enjoyed greater privileges than the people of Great Britain. The statesmen of Great Britain realized that any


