LIFE AND HOPE

For the second time during last few tempestuous months in Russia, Korniloff is up in arms against the constituted authority of the government. Some months ago, he could see whither the policy of Kerensky was leading and hel realized the weakness of a people drunk with their new found freedom. Too well he knew the difference between freedom and licence and his demand for discipline and obedience to the law, whither civil or military, was logical. His forces melted away, however, when it came to fighting against the burning enthusiasm of Kerensky. Now Kerensky is no more a power in Russia, so far as can be

learned. This time Korniloff has a man of a different stamp to oppose in the person of Trotsky. He may be more successful. Whether he should become dictator of Russia either for his own glory or for the ultimate good of the Russian people, it is safe to say that he will be enabled to present a formidable front to the Kaiser, if he comes out on top. If the Russian people have any sense at all. they will know that a general peace, which all the belligerents desire, can only come after the danger of the further breaking of that peace is finally removed. That can only come when the military caste in Germany is decisively discredited among the German people themselves. And the only way to do that is to beat the German armies in the field until they are powerless for further harm. More power to Kernileff!




